Smoke Fire Workshop Student Materials List

May 24 – 25, 2025

Clay, Smoke & Fire Experience the excitement and spontaneity of smoke firing. We will build a simple sawdust kiln and learn to create pots with a primal elegance. Three distinct firing methods will occur: a 24 hour slow burning sawdust fire for smoked atmospheric magic; a 5 minute "paint with fire" process using various resists; and finally foil saggar, to capture a consistent gray and black undertone to contrast with colorful surface work. Dry Burnishing and the use application and use of terra sigillata will be demonstrated.

Preparation of pots you may want to bring to workshop

Please bring 6-12 small pieces, preferably burnished or polished with terra sigillata and bisque fired. I find that clays receive the smoke more effectively if bisque fired as follows: **low fire** to **cone 012-010**. **Mid range and high fire** to **cone 08-06**.

If desired, some pieces for the sager fire can be decorated and then bisque fired with Amaco Velvet Underglaze. Note for the quick fire where we will be "painting with fire", it is best to have shallow simple dishes with a gentle curve and Tsig painted on interior surface. I would suggest two to three.

In addition, if you can, bring a small leather hard pinch pot or thrown rounded piece and one bone dry small pot for application of Tsig and underglaze **If you do not have pre made pots to bring to the workshop, don't worry, I will have small bisque trays (with Tsig) to purchase for \$6 per piece, to use in the quick firings (and the traditional 24 hour Smoke Fire)**
